Upcoming dates:

Tuesday 2nd June Children return to school after the half term break.

Week Commencing 2nd June MTC All children in year 4 will take their official Multiplication Skills Check during the first week back in school. Please use the time in the holidays to keep practicing, especially if your child is still not feeling confident.

Week Commencing 8th June We need as many children as we can to come to Breakfast club. Our numbers this week determine the level of funding we will receive and I am keen to keep the service going.

Week Commencing 8th June Year 1 children take their Phonics Screening Check through the course of this week.

9th June New **Reception** intake meeting 1:45pm. A meeting for all parents of children who will be starting with us in Reception class in September 2026.

9th June 3:20pm a meeting for parents about Relationships and Sex Education lessons which are taught through the course of the summer term in each year group from Year 1 up to Year 6.

12th June A special day in school called School of Sanctuary Day of Welcome where children learn about the experiences of refugees and asylum seekers. The following week is refugee week in school. We are proud to have the status of School of Sanctuary here at Westwood Park.

Headteacher Messages

Ofsted Report: Leaders keep a consistent focus on pupils' behaviour and attendance. They have been successful in improving overall attendance rates across different groups of pupils over time. They have ensured the school is a welcoming place for pupils and their families. A notable nurturing ethos, supported by sensitive pastoral care, helps pupils feel safe and valued. As a result, many more pupils now attend school regularly.

Year 2: Our children in Year 2 took their SATs this week. They have worked very hard in class and we are incredibly proud of them. Thank you to all our parents for your support.

Attendance: 145 children had full attendance for the Summer 1 half term which is brilliant! The numbers are slowly increasing each half term! Mrs Lamb and I will be sending out some little letters to families where we have a concern about attendance. We just want everyone here in school, learning and in a good routine. If you do get one of these letters (via email), then try your best to get on the 100% certificate list for the last half term of the year!

Governors: Our school Governors met last week to go through our school finances and to discuss our recent Ofsted report.

PRIDE Morning: Thanks to all our parents who came to Pride morning and our coffee morning. I love it when our parents join us in school. Thank you for your support.

SEND: All our Teaching Assistants had training on ADHD this week. That means that as a staff we are all now fully trained to support this group of children.

Half term and INSET Day: It has been a very busy half term with lots happening but as always, a brilliant one. School closes on Friday for half term and opens on TUESDAY 2nd June at 8:15am for our last half term of the academic year. There is a teacher training day on Monday 1st June.
